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
## DIRT TO GOLD

# STUDENT CORNER: BOOK REVIEW BY HENVI PATEL (GR 12)



If you're looking for an easy, quirky, and light-hearted romance to cozy up with this coming winter, The Off Limits Rule by Sarah Adams is an absolute must-read. The story casts a spotlight onto Lucy's life- a single, unemployed mother who moved in with her elder brother Drew. Drew is a doctor and they have always been friends more than siblings. While they share good times, he has an absolute 'Off Limits Rule' about Lucy dating his best friend, Cooper. Cooper is flirtatious, adventurous, and non-committal. Healing his heart after a terrible break-up, he is scared to go all in for love. Lucy tries to stick to the rules, but Cooper is hard to resist, and their chemistry is undeniable. What follows

is a funny, sweet, and swoon-worthy romance that checks all the boxes for fans of feel-good stories. The author has a knack for creating characters that feel real and relatable, while also infusing enough humor and lightness to keep things fun. Lucy and Cooper's banter is just the right mix of charming and hilarious.

As the story develops, the stakes rise for both Lucy and Cooper. For Lucy, a new relationship means trusting someone with her child, Levi, and for Cooper, a new relationship would mean opening up and trusting someone— something that doesn't come naturally to him. And for both of them, having a relationship would mean having to go behind Drew's back. But, of course, the heart has its plans, and sparks fly when the two are thrown together in a close—knit, unexpected situation.

Adams' writing is charming and easy to get lost in, making the book an ideal wintertime escape. Grab a blanket, and a cup of hot cocoa, and let yourself dive into this feel-good read!
