

2024 is the world's oldest international writing competition for schools, established in 1883.


With thousands of young people from different parts of the world taking part each year, it is an important way to recognize achievement, elevate youth voices and develop key skills through creative writing.

Riverside students competed in the *CEMC Math* competition that spans the entire globe. Our students have managed to appear within the *top 25% of the globe*.







Music Club






Series Review- How to Train Your Dragon

Most people have heard of the How to Train Your Dragon franchise. With three movies spanning a decade and excellent characters, it is a beloved series for many. There is, of course, debate over which movie is the best. The first movie introduces us to Hiccup and Toothless and the amazing bond they share. In the second movie, we watch Hiccup grow and come to embrace his role as leader and chief of his people. The third movie is a devastating but fitting conclusion to the series as Hiccup and Toothless part ways to lead the people of Berk and all the dragons respectively. However, not many are aware of the hidden gem of the franchise: How to Train Your Dragon: Race to the Edge.

The TV series set in the interim between the first two films spans six seasons and is available on Netflix. I would argue that it is the best written work of cinematic genius that has been produced in the history of the franchise, if not Dreamworks itself. The characters are explored to a degree that is simply not possible in a two-hour long film. The humor is brilliant (shoutout to the twins). Hiccstrid is (finally) made official. There is drama and character growth and the villains, ugh, the villains. The best animated villain ever came from this series and he is magnificent. Period.

The series is set after the events of the first movie and the first two accompanying TV shows (Riders of Berk and Defenders of Berk). Though they do provide valuable context (and fun shenanigans) during the gang's teenage years, I don't think they are necessary to follow along with Race to the Edge.

Book Review- The Inheritance Games

The Inheritance Games by Jennifer Lynn Barnes is a young adult novel that combines mystery, family drama, and a hint of romance. The story follows Avery Grambs, an ordinary teenager whose life changes when she unexpectedly inherits the fortune of billionaire Tobias Hawthorne. The twist? Neither Avery nor the Hawthorne family knows why she was chosen. To claim her inheritance, Avery must live in the Hawthorne estate for a year, surrounded by a family that resents

The central plot revolves around Avery and the four Hawthorne brothers—Grayson, the "heir"; Nash, the laid-back "cowboy"; Jameson, the thrill-seeking "puzzle solver"; and Xander, the quirky "machine enthusiast." Together, they unravel the puzzle left by their grandfather, navigating through family secrets and rivalries. As Avery gets closer to the truth, an unexpected twist leaves her and the Hawthorne family shocked, ending the story on a suspenseful cliffhanger.


Avery's resilience is a major strength of the novel. Despite the hostility from the Hawthorne family and threats on her life, she remains determined to solve the mystery. Jameson's obsession with puzzles adds energy to the story, while Xander's humor and warmth make him a particularly likable character. Grayson's protective, hot-and-cold attitude toward Avery, while initially intriguing, becomes somewhat predictable, and Nash's role is more supportive than central.

The novel explores themes of wealth, family, and identity, particularly the concept of inheritance and the sacrifices made for loved ones. The treasure-hunt style of the plot, filled with secret passages and clues, keeps readers engaged, though certain parts—like Avery and Jameson's prolonged search for a tree—can feel repetitive.

One character that feels less essential is Emily, Jameson's deceased ex-girlfriend. Her involvement in the story seems unnecessary in this book, though she may play a larger role in future installments.

Overall, the relationships between Avery and the Hawthorne brothers, especially Xander, bring warmth and humor to the novel. Despite their competition, the brothers maintain a healthy bond, adding to the family drama. The Inheritance Games is a fast-paced, engaging novel, perfect for fans of young adult mysteries. Its blend of suspense, intriguing puzzles, and well-crafted characters makes it a compelling read. I would rate it 4 out of 5 stars for its captivating plot and strong character development.

If you enjoy thrilling, puzzle-filled mysteries with a touch of family drama, this book is highly recommended
